#### COVID - Emergency Meals

The Fayette County Public School System's School Nutrition Program continues to provide an opportunity for all families in our community to drive through and pick up breakfast and lunch. Any child (18 and under) is eligible and must be present in order for the meals to be provided (students with disabilities age 21 and under are also eligible to participate).
